3. Site Performance and Operations


#### **Update**



- We have had problems with the remote readout of the meters used for calculating the feed-in tariff (FIT) and power purchase agreement (PPA) revenue. No income has been lost but readings must now be taken directly from the meters onsite. We are working to repair the remote readout.
- Security cameras have been replaced and the fence repaired where needed.
- Minor rust on the inverter/transformer containers has been treated and repaired.
- In conjunction with the owners of adjacent solar farms that use it, the access track has been refurbished.
- During the past year we sought to purchase spare parts for critical items likely to be difficult to obtain at short notice. The cost so far is approximately £16,000. Three inverter components are yet to sourced.


#### **Monthly Generation for Year to September 2025**

#### 6. Future business strategy

Projected surpluses generated to June 2028:

Year ending	Surplus funds available (cumulative)
June 2026	£978,000
June 2027	£1,198,000
June 2028	£1,368,000

The board is currently considering three options for deployment of surpluses:

- 1. Accelerated repayment of member capital
- 2. Investment in the 2MW Merston extension
- 3. Supporting more community benefit projects

# Meadow Blue Community Energy

#### 7. Merston site extension

- 2MW of additional solar capacity within the same field as the existing solar farm but developed as a separate site.
- Sharing a grid connection with the existing project under split-FiT regulations.
- Project currently progressing through the grid connections reform process with an updated grid connection offer expected prior to 31<sup>st</sup> March 2026.
- All required works to the surrounding grid infrastructure to allow the project to be able to connect to the grid estimated to be completed by May 2026.
- Planning permission in place for the project which was granted as part of the original solar farm development and restored for the extension project via a non-material amendment.
- Variation to lease completed, deadline of April 2027 to decide if project is going ahead.
- GB Energy grants announced for 'shovel ready' community energy projects with planning, land and grid secured. Applications expected to be open this week.
- South Downs National Park interested in lending to the project.
- Capital value c. £2m

#### 8. Community Benefit



- VAAC (Voluntary Action Arun & Chichester)
  - £25,000 grant
  - VAAC End of grant report July 25 "The funding provided essential support for both strategic
    advisory services and the operational capacity needed to promote climate action at the community
    level. The outcomes demonstrate strong value for money, with multiple VAAC members supported
    to access green funding and take meaningful steps toward net zero."
  - Grant funded 2 projects:
    - Cobnor Activity Centre wheelchair-accessible waterless toilet (£10,000)
    - Wheels of Change (£9,738)
- New Park Centre in Chichester
  - Solar PV
    - Decided to grant fund rather than soft loan.
    - Roof survey.
    - Trustees agreed to go ahead.
    - Progressing planning.
  - Cavity wall and loft insulation decided against this due to damp issues and change of use of
    offices below loft.
- Chestnut Tree Hospice
  - £35,000 towards an £85,000 solar array
